


Let's SOAR! SOAR Time at Holmes MS

SOAR DEFINITION: SOAR Time is school-wide time dedicated to developing students' academic and SEL skills and building positive relationships.

How will it work?

- SOAR is your child's 4th period class that meets every day
- The first 20 days of school is all SOAR
- Later in the year it will be about twice a week once intervention starts
- Small class sizes lend to a strong sense of community

SOAR is your child's home base at Holmes.

- Build positive relationships
 & class community.
- Develop students' academic and SEL skills
- Learn and practice skills (i.e. digital citizenship, organization, SEL skills, etc...).





Exceptions

- 1. We will still offer the full continuum of services for students with disabilities. For those students whose disability requires access to a modified curriculum we will continue to have self-contained and Cat B classes.
- 2. For students who are new to the country and are still in the early stages of learning the English language (WIDA levels 1 and 2), we will continue to offer them sheltered ESOL classes to ensure they have the intensive language support they need before moving into an Honors setting.
